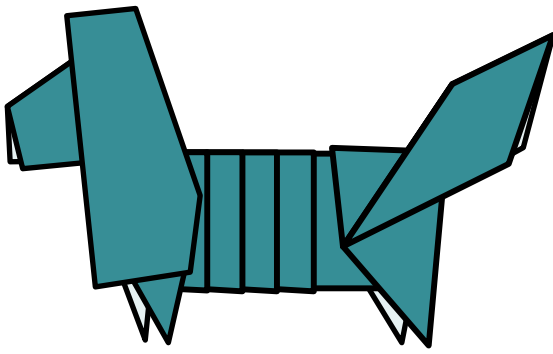




Basset Hound

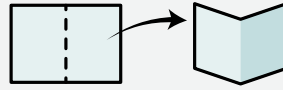

I learned to fold this model from a demonstration at Origami Kaikan in Tokyo in 2018. It's perfect for folding with chopstick wrappers!

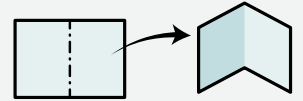

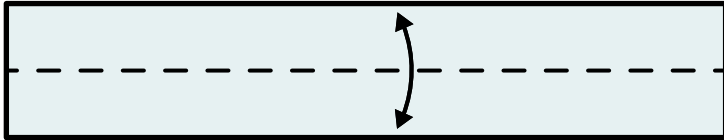

Valley fold

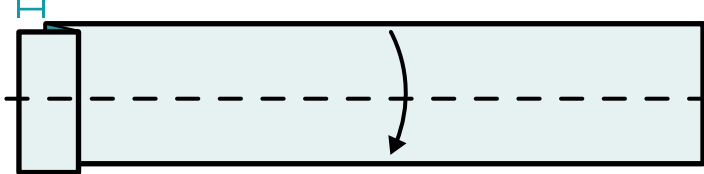


Mountain fold

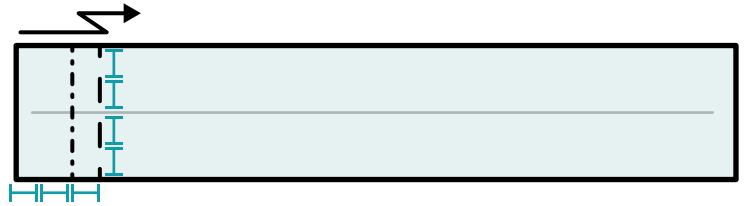


fold and unfold

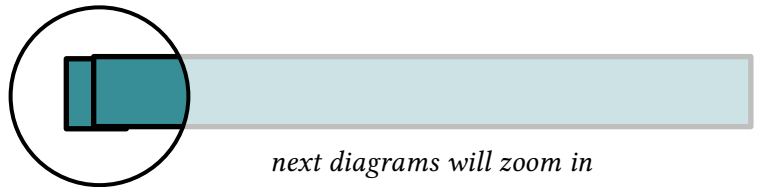
finished pleat should protrude by slightly less than a quarter of the paper's height



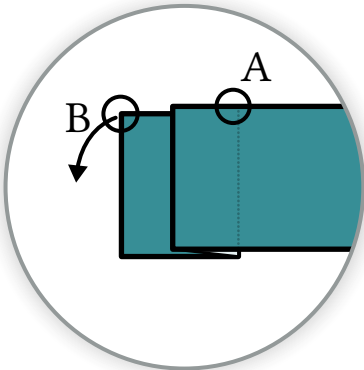
fold in half along existing crease



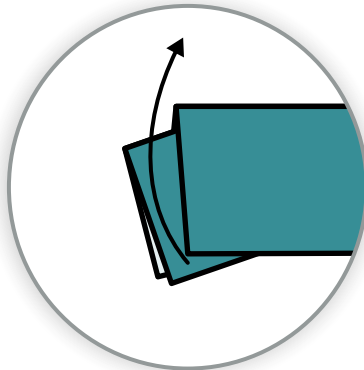
*pleat. see finished pleat in next diagram.
width should be a quarter of the paper's height. make sure to leave slightly less than this width sticking out the end to make the dog's face*



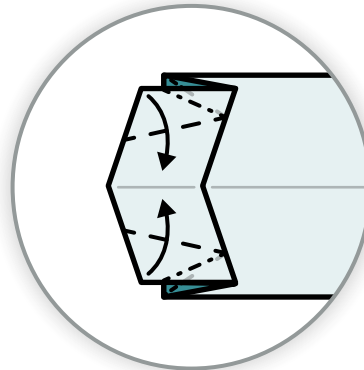
next diagrams will zoom in



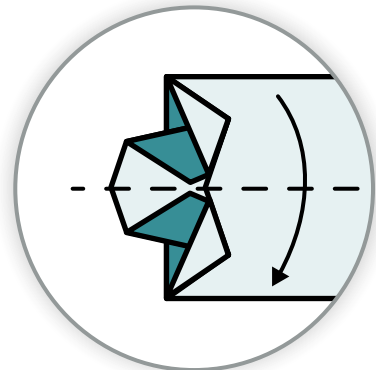
pinch firmly around point A with one hand while pulling point B downwards to create the head.



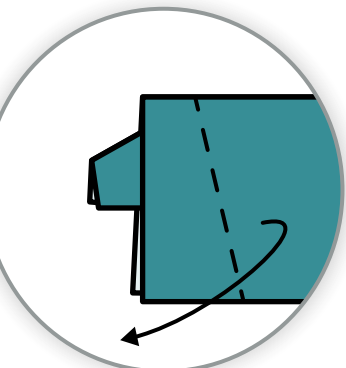
open up model again. model will not lie flat



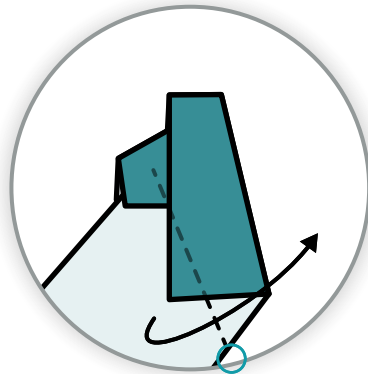
swivel fold edges into center to narrow head



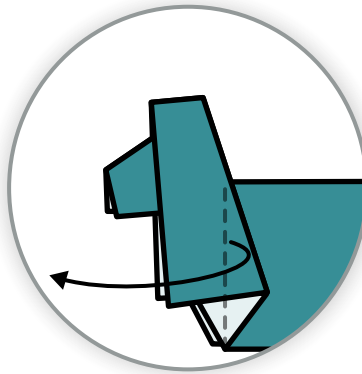
fold model in half again. model should now lie flat



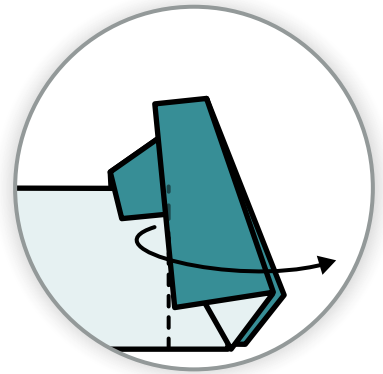
inside reverse fold

inside reverse fold innermost flap. try to keep back horizontal



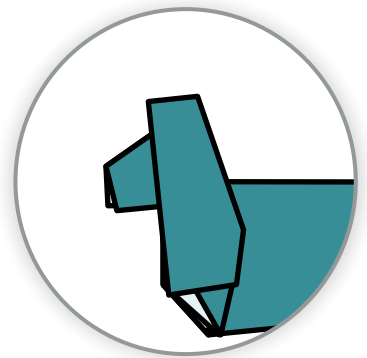

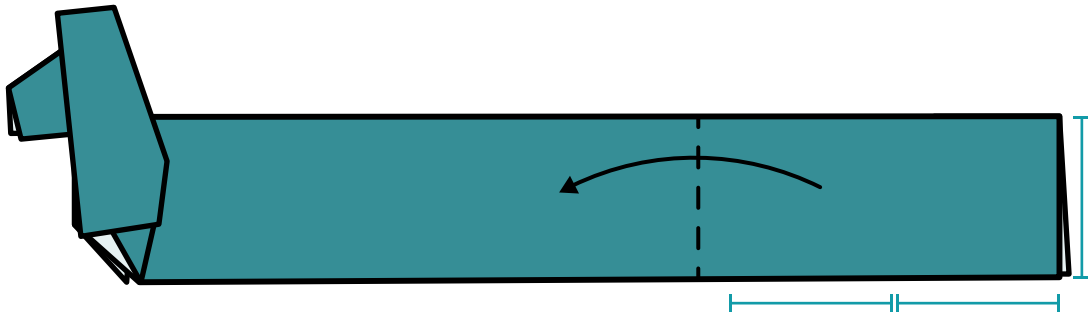

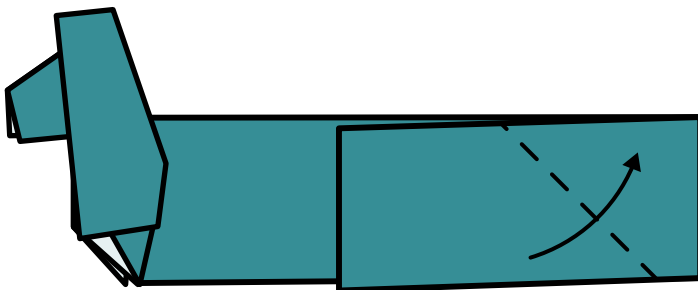
*reverse fold angle bisector

completed fold



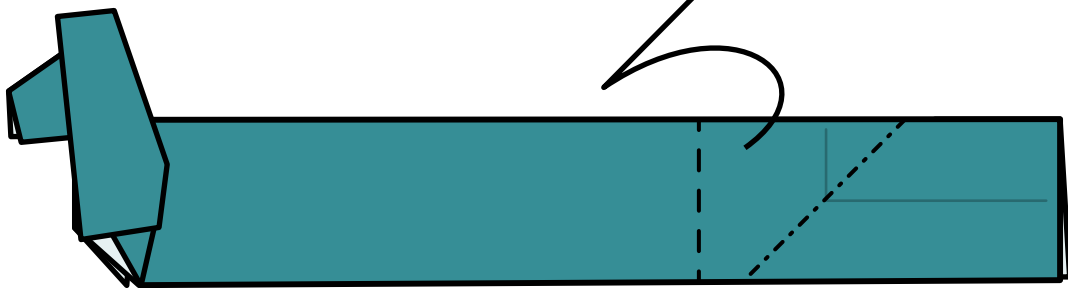

than twice its height*



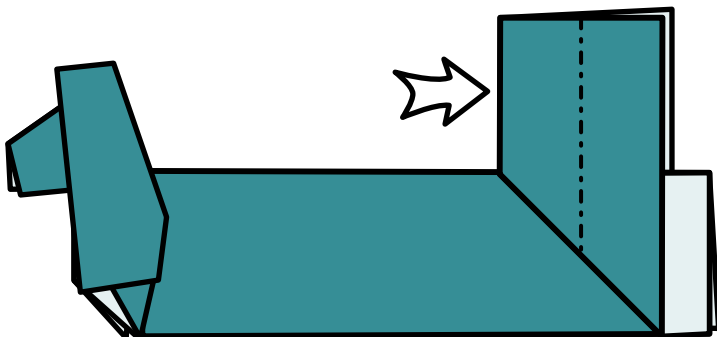
